TOP SCIENCE STUDENT LUCAS BUICK ATTENDS ROTARY NATIONAL SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY FORUM

Te Kura o Tititea Mount Aspiring College Year 13 student Lucas Buick was one of only 168 students across the country selected to attend the Rotary National Science and Technology Forum in Auckland last January.

Lucas was selected by Wānaka Rotary to attend the event which recognises the top-achieving science students nationwide.

Lucas said the forum provided him with many valuable learning opportunities.

"I really enjoyed making connections with other students who are passionate about science and professors who are leaders in their scientific fields.

"I now have a better understanding of the major science subjects at a university and career level which will enable me to make more informed choices about my future."

Colin Sharp of Wānaka Rotary Youth said the forum was an important opportunity for like-minded students to meet and foster their interest in science.

"We believe this event helps broaden students' minds and gives them valuable insights into future career opportunities in the field.
