

# 2026 HOSTEL APPLICATION PACK

To gain entry to our Hostel programme, students need to complete an application process. Each year, we offer 30 places for students in Year 13.

The most important criteria we look for in selecting students for our Hostel Programme are detailed below (but are not restricted to this list):

- willingness to take on new challenges and a 'can-do' attitude
- willingness to get involved at school and outside school
- self-motivated and independent
- good behavioural record
- good academic attitude
- fit and healthy.

The application process includes:

- submission of a personal letter and CV from the student
- an interview with one of our senior leadership team
- a confidential reference from the applicant's school dean
- provision of latest school reports and results
- a medical declaration.

Five of the College's senior management staff consider each application separately. Then, the panel of five meet to discuss the applicants and decide who is offered a place. The panel's decision **is final**.

# Application process

Your completed application must be received **by email** to <u>learn@mtaspiring.school.nz</u> <u>no later</u> than 9.00am Friday 27 June, and you must have attended an interview (in person or online) by Friday 25 July. (We will acknowledge receipt of your application by email, so please follow up if you haven't heard from us).

Please make sure that you include:

- a cover letter (written by the student) stating the reasons you wish to attend Mount Aspiring College
- your CV (please do not send original documents or testimonials)
- a copy of your latest school report
- a copy of your NCEA (or equivalent) results
- a recent photograph
- Hostel application form
- Medical information and declaration form
- Hostel application fee of \$250 **non-refundable** (deposited to 03-1739-0027820-00 reference 'hostel / student surname').



To support your application, we require a **confidential report from your dean** at your current school. Please use the report form included in this pack. This report should be forwarded <u>directly</u> from your school to reach Mount Aspiring College by the application closing date of **9.00am Friday 27 June**. Please give your dean plenty of time to do this.

### **Booking interviews**

The booking process and deadlines are outlined below. The interview is compulsory and is a two-way process allowing us to find out more about the applicant, and allowing the applicant to determine whether the Mount Aspiring College Hostel Programme is the right choice for them. Bookings are essential, please allow one hour for the interview.

The two options for interviews are as follows (please book one interview only):

#### Wānaka: Friday 11 July 2025

Interviews will be held at the College on Friday 11 July. You should allow two hours for both the interview and a tour of the school and Hostel (plus travel time to Wānaka if you are staying out of town).

To book an interview go to <u>www.schoolinterviews.co.nz</u> and enter the event code **w98tp** - follow the onscreen instructions. Bookings close at 9.00am Friday 27 June.

#### Online interviews: 15 July - 25 July 2025

Online interviews will be held after school from 3.30pm to 5.30pm during the first two weeks of Term 3. You should allow up to one hour for the interview. Please make sure that you are ready for the online meeting 5-10 minutes prior to your interview time.

To book an online interview go to <u>www.schoolinterviews.co.nz</u> and enter the event code **uvqbm** - follow the onscreen instructions. **Bookings close at 9.00am Friday 27 June.** 

A booking confirmation email will be sent to you. Please retain this email as it enables you to make changes or cancel your booking. Closer to the interview date, we will email you instructions for accessing your online Google Meet interview. # **Application outcome**

We will email applicants the outcome of the selection process by 3.00pm, Friday 22 August 2025.

We will send an offer of place by email and <u>we require a written acceptance of the offer within three</u> <u>working days, and payment of a \$1,000 deposit within seven days</u>, otherwise the place will be offered to the next person on the waiting list.

# Arrival date (TBC)

The hostel year starts with an orientation programme three days before school starts. At this point hostel students are expected to arrive between 9.00am - 9.30am on Tuesday 27 January 2026. The orientation is a crucial part of the Hostel Programme and it is important that all new hostellers attend. (This date is subject to change and will be confirmed in the Hostel Handbook on acceptance to the programme).



# **Hostel contracts**

Once you have accepted a place in the Hostel Programme, we will send you a Hostel Handbook and Hostel contracts. The student and parent(s) are asked to sign the contracts which set out standards of behaviour and conditions relating to the student's time in the Hostel. We would like to draw your attention to the following information regarding the withdrawal of students, and emotional and medical conditions which form part of the Hostel contract.

### a) Emotional and medical conditions

Parents and students should be aware that the programme is very demanding and intensive. The programme is designed to develop skills for independent living and the level of medical and/or emotional support that can be offered is limited due to the remoteness of Wānaka. In addition, the Hostel is not a suitable environment for students who require individual care and supervision due to long-term medical conditions.

We ask you to provide a Medical Declaration from your doctor, and signed by the student and parent, stating any medical or psychological conditions which may require support during the year. Any information given will remain confidential to the selection panel during the application process, but may be disclosed to the guidance counsellor, senior dean and the Hostel management team if you are accepted into the Hostel.

Should such a condition come to light during the year and the student's success or safety (or that of other students) is compromised, then parents may be asked to remove their student from the Hostel. If you wish to discuss such an issue prior to application please contact Deputy Principal, Hamish Crosbie on 03 443 0499 for a confidential discussion.

Where students suffer from a short term illness during their time at the Hostel, parents may be asked to remove them temporarily if they are infectious or require nursing. Any additional costs relating to individual care will be charged to parents. We strongly recommend that students are up to date with vaccinations prior to joining the Hostel.

### b) Withdrawal of students

Once accepted onto the programme, a deposit of **\$1,000** is required to confirm the place. Should a student withdraw, this deposit is non-refundable, even if they withdraw prior to the start of the programme.

Due to the nature of the programme, it is not always possible to fill a place should a student withdraw once the school year has started. It is therefore important that students are fully committed to the programme.

The following conditions apply to fees payable on withdrawal:

- 1. In the event of a student having to withdraw from the Hostel, parents are required to give one full term's notice in writing or pay a term's fee in lieu thereof.
- 2. If the withdrawal is because of an unforeseen medical condition or other unforeseen circumstances then parents may appeal in writing to the School Board for this fee to be waived.
- 3. If parents choose to send their child in the knowledge that they had a pre-existing medical or psychological condition that was not disclosed in the Medical Declaration, and the child subsequently withdraws from the hostel, the full year's fees are payable.

### Alcohol and smoking/vaping policy

The hostel and school premises are (by law) smokefree, non-vaping, and alcohol-free environments.

#### In addition to the above fees:

- School curriculum and activity fees also apply. These fees vary for different subjects. Please see the <a href="https://courseguide.mtaspiring.school.nz/">https://courseguide.mtaspiring.school.nz/</a> for details.
- Hostel students will need to purchase a season ski pass from the Cardrona office in Wānaka (at the local student rate).
- A College donation of **\$110.00** will be included in the Term 1 fees invoice.
- A **\$1,000** bond is collected with the Term 1 payment. The cost of any general damage or loss to hostel units and any unpaid school or hostel fees are deducted from this bond at the end of the year, and the balance is refunded. Any damage or loss attributable to individual students is invoiced as it occurs.

### **Payment of fees**

- 1. An application fee of **\$250** with application (**non-refundable**). Payment to be made by direct credit to 03-1739-0027820-00 (referencing hostel and student surname) at the time your application is sent.
- 2. A deposit of **\$1,000** to confirm acceptance of a hostel place <u>within one week of acceptance of the offer</u>. This payment is non-refundable.
- 3. Term 1 fees are payable by 1 December 2025, prior to attending, as follows:

4. The balance of the boarding fees are payable each term by the following dates:

- 5. School activity and curriculum fees are invoiced separately as applicable.
- 6. With parent permission, hostel students are able to put incidental school expenses on their school accounts. These should be paid in full each month.

## Ministry of Education boarding bursaries

Parents may be eligible for Ministry of Education bursaries. As a general rule, if you are currently eligible for a boarding bursary on the grounds of distance from the nearest school, then you would normally be eligible for the same boarding bursary to attend Mount Aspiring College. However, you will need to reapply to the Ministry of Education due to the change in schools. Email <u>boarding.allowances@education.govt.nz</u> to check eligibility.
